

1 JABBERWOCKY MAZE

The Jabberwock is a creature from the poem Jabberwocky by Charles Lutwidge Dodgson (Lewis Carroll).

What do you think the Jabberwock looks like?

Write a nonsense word from the poem -you can find them on silver posts near the Jabberwock

Walk along Eastgate Gardens to the Upper High St. Turn right, then keep looking right as you walk along until you see:

2 SHEEP



These sheep are a reminder that the wealth of Guildford came from the wool trade

Tick the box when you find find the sheepdog watching the sheep



Use the crossing then continue downhill until you see:

Just across the High St in Jeffreys Passage find:

3 GEORGE ABBOT



What important job did George Abbot have?

When was he born?

When did he die?

4 400th ANNIVERSARY PANELS



These 4 tiled panels celebrate 400 years of Abbot's Hospital, and show some of the ways life has changed in that time.

Name something you can see from each of the panels:

5 WARRIOR ANGEL



This commemorates the death in WWI of Major Geoffrey Parnell. The angel was designed by his sister, the artist Edith Farmiloe.

6 GUILDFORD NEW WAR MEMORIAL



This sculpture commemorates servicemen who have died in service since World War II.

Continue left down path then turn right back into the Castle Grounds. Pass the pond on your right and turn left as you leave through the arch. Cross Quarry St and go down the steps of Rosemary Alley. Cross to the theatre, then over the river bridges. Turn right and look for:

8 ALICE in WONDERLAND

Go back to the bridge and use the crossing to the High St. At the junction with Quarry St you will find:

10 THE SURREY SCHOLAR
