
# Conversation pieces for a memory-friendly trail

A considerable part of the present building dates from the 15<sup>th</sup> century, built in the Late Perpendicular style typical of the period with large windows, high arches, and tall pillars.

# 8 THE EAST WINDOW




Look up at the window behind the Altar. What thoughts come to mind?
