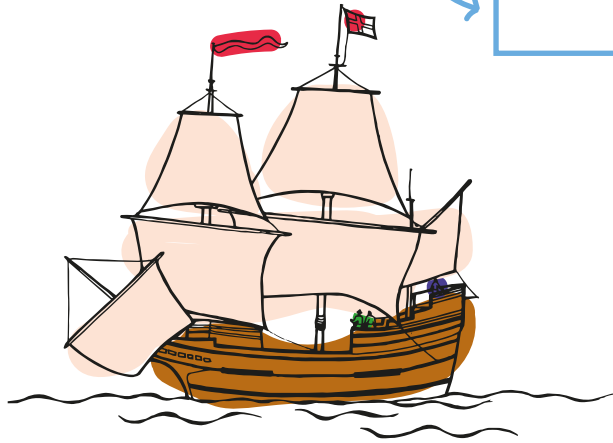

What was the name of the nation of people who already lived where the Mayflower landed? →

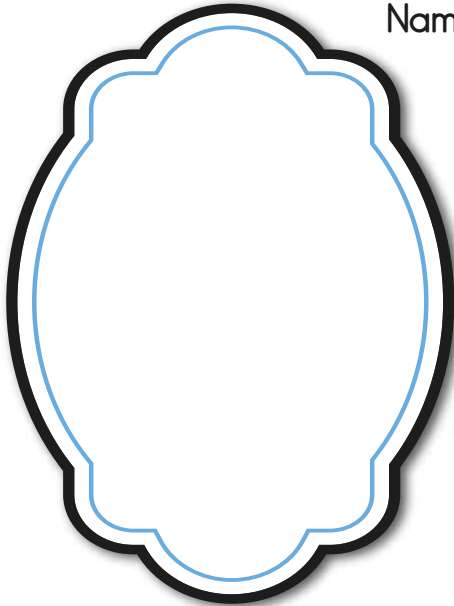


Draw the routes of the Mayflower and Speedwell on the map.
The passengers from Leiden boarded the Speedwell and departed from Delfshaven. The Mayflower departed from Rotherhithe in London. The two ships met in Southampton. They leave, but have to stop in Dartmouth as the Speedwell is leaking. They leave and head out to sea. The Speedwell continues to leak so both ships return to Plymouth. The Mayflower departs from Plymouth, leaving the Speedwell behind. The ship was aiming for the Hudson River, but instead, after a brief pause in Provincetown Harbour, landed in Plymouth Harbour.

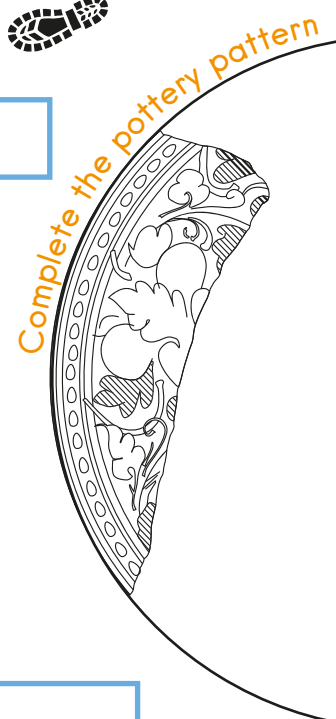

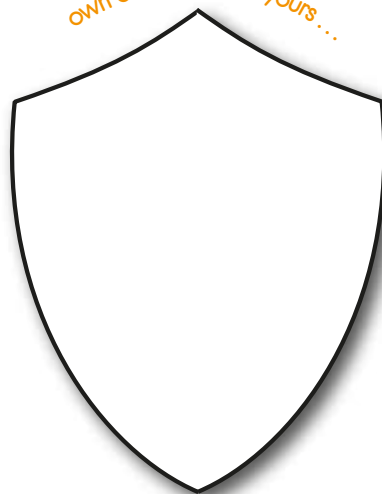


Rodents spread disease so most ships had a cat to hunt them!

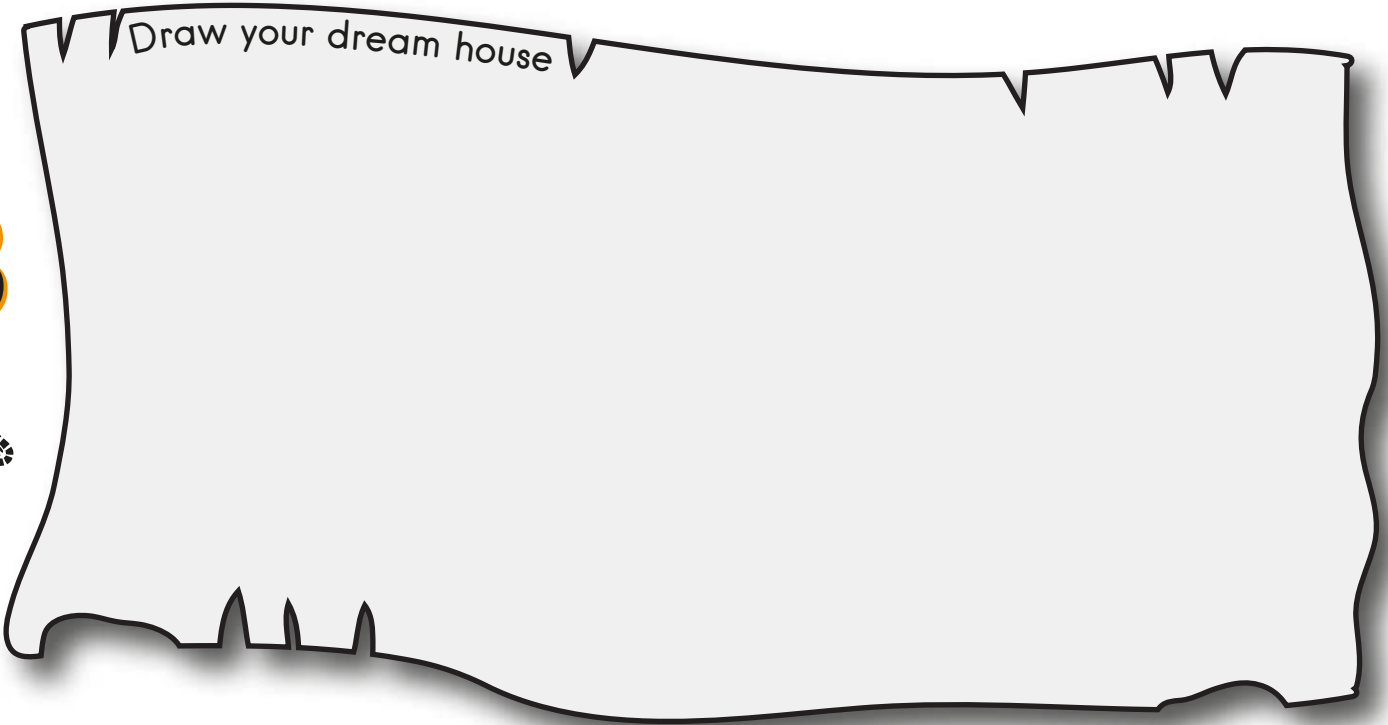

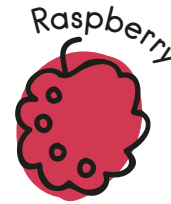
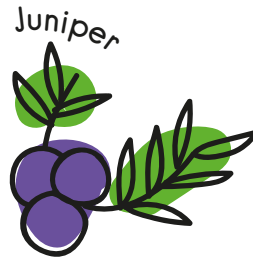
