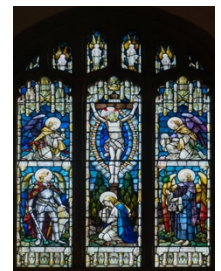
5 East Window

How can you tell that he is an angel?

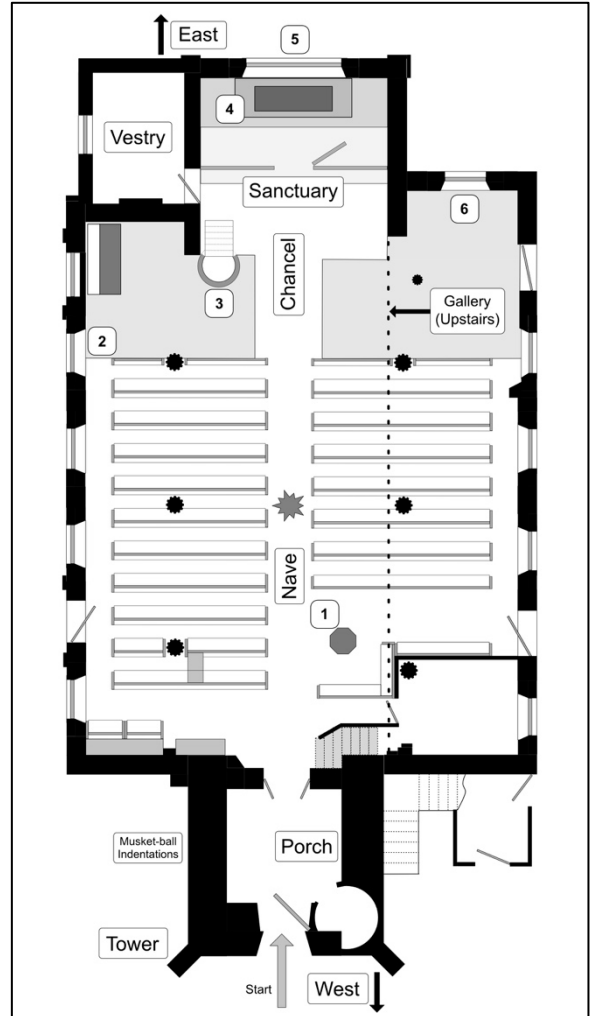

8 Roof of the Nave

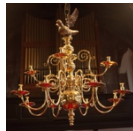
Stand by the font and look up.

9 Chandelier

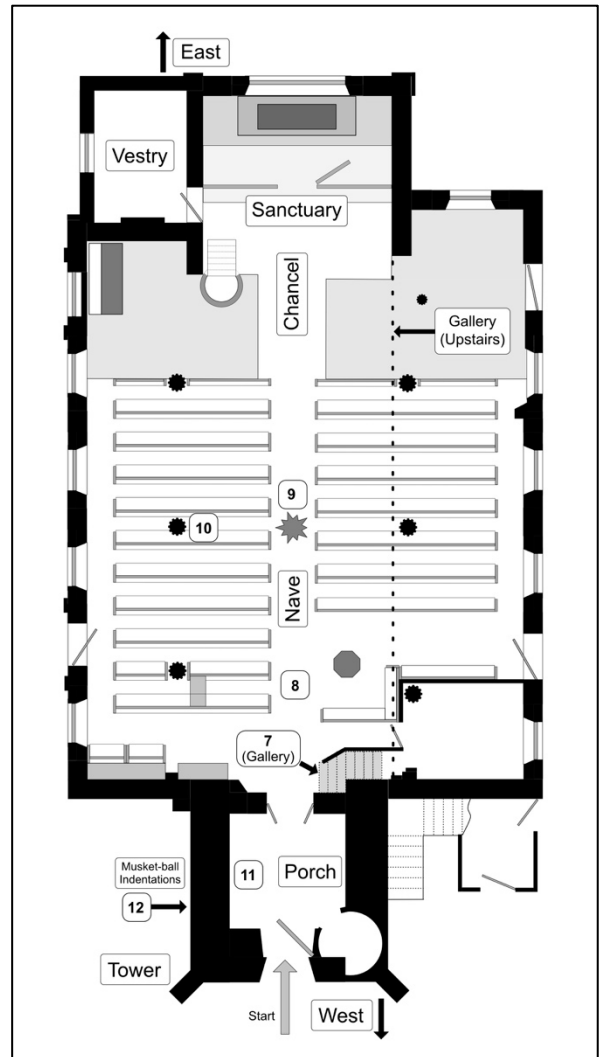
The chandelier (which is made of brass) hangs from the roof, stand by the font and look up.
