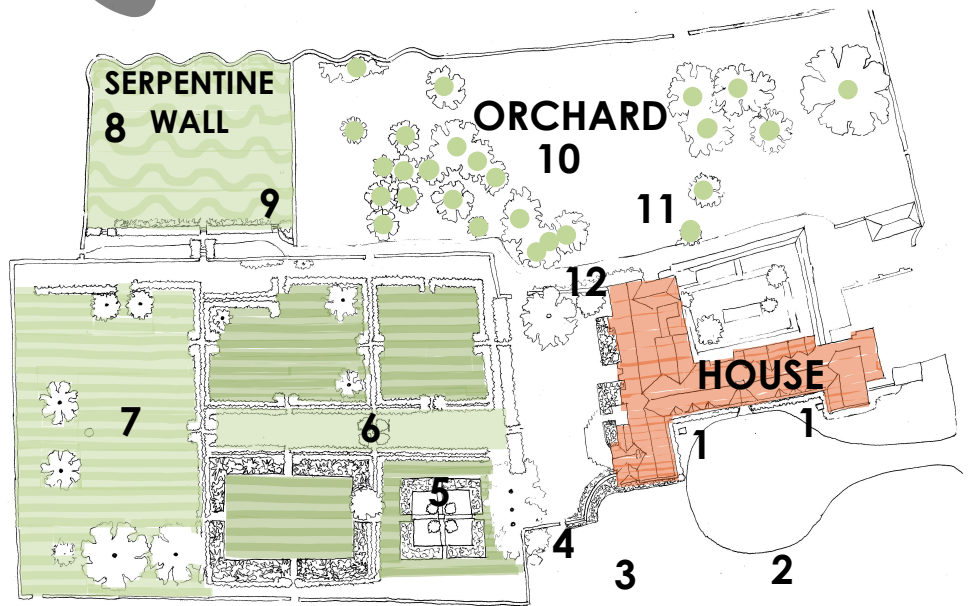


CHILDREN'S GARDEN TRAIL

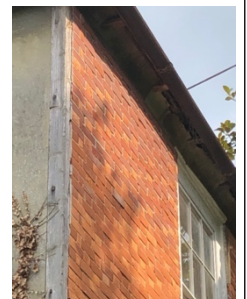
